PASTOR JEANETTE'S ARTICLE

Dear First Lutheran,

I was sitting in the Fall Rostered Leaders Conference a while back and found myself looking around. I noticed I was younger than most people gathered. Later, I asked Pr. Heather Culuris, Assistant to the Bishop for Southwestern MN, "Am I one of about 40 people under the age of 40 who are pastors in the synod?" She noted, 'You probably are not too far off on that estimation."

This moment got me really thinking about what the end of my career as a pastor might look like. Currently, there are around 40 pastoral vacancies in our synod. In the four rural synods of Minnesota, there are about 100 vacancies. We have been very fortunate to have had a good number of ordinations over the past few years. Many of those ordinations, though, have been people serving in second careers. Therefore, in order to continue to fill vacancies, exponentially more ordinations must take place in order to fill even most openings. (Many second career individuals serve 10 years as opposed to over 40 years.). I know that many of my colleagues are at or near retirement age. Several have served beyond retirement age in order to help our denomination continue to fill pastoral vacancies. I am very grateful for such individuals who have graciously served.

I am not writing this to "sound the alarm," but rather to help people understand the situation. I strongly believe that people cannot help solve problems if they are not made aware of such realities. Many other denominations are in similar positions. Often, I find that when I approach youth and their parents/grandparents and urge their youth to consider the ministry, people seem very hesitant. Often people note it seems like it would be a challenging career. I won't deny that it often is. However, I also know that your careers, likewise, often seem challenging. Furthermore, of course, there are many rewarding aspects of being a pastor. I am grateful for the support of colleagues, and I feel blessed to be in a career where we view each other as supporters instead of competitors. I am honored to be invited into some of people's most important moments of their lives. Every day is different, and I am almost never bored in my work. I am blessed by the support of you all, members of First Lutheran, and I enjoy the fun we have together. We have several young people who have a heart for service and a love of the Gospel. Please encourage them to consider the ministry. Our church needs such compassionate, intelligent and creative individuals.

Likewise, some of you might be reading this and thinking, "I might be open to serving in the ministry, but I surely am not a young person." If that is the case, please come talk to me, and I will connect you with synodical staff who can explore options. Nowadays, there are a myriad of ways people can pursue ordination. There are options that are mostly online, options that are designed to spread out coursework over a longer period of time, options that reduce the amount of coursework required, options that allow people to finish degrees quickly and more. Synod staff will work with you to explore possibilities.

Lastly, I should note my appreciation because you all have helped solve the problem of the current clergy shortage. Though it required accommodations, forming an internship committee and adjustments, First Lutheran and Grace Lutheran supported Jon Wendt in completing his pastoral education. Not only did this provide Grace Lutheran with a vicar, but it has helped our synod have one more pastor (and, therefore, one less opening). Likewise, you all agreed to support Adonis Albanes as a "remote" member while he was living in Spain. This individual had expressed an interest in pursuing ordination in the ELCA but needed to be a member of a congregation. With consultation from the synod, we were able to find ways to include Albanes in our congregation, even while he was living on another continent. Though Albanes had to step back from this journey forward due to health and family concerns, the conversation alone was valuable. Our work around this topic has helped the synod to think "out of the box" about how we can provide candidates for ethnic specific ministries. Some people might be reading this and thinking, "Why is this my concern?" The truth is, if we are going to solve the problem of increasing numbers of pastoral vacancies, we all need to work together to provide solutions. The situation might not seem to be affecting us right now, but the fewer pastors there are, the more our synod staff has to try to support congregations with no pastors. Likewise, this shortage also translates to remaining pastors serving in more capacities on committees, boards, and in positions of leadership. Thank you for your willingness to help us all find a path forward where our congregations are well served.

Please pray for synodical staff as they continue to work to raise up leaders. Please, likewise, prayerfully consider people in your lives who might be willing to serve in the ministry. We trust that, as we do this, God will provide for our churches as God has always provided for us.

Ancient zoologists listed the kinds of fish in the world at precisely 153. The number 153, therefore, might symbolize all the nations of the world. Jesus' Parable of the Net would support this. (Matthew 13:47-50)

John's comment that the net didn't tear might also be interpreted to support it: There's room in the kingdom for everyone. The kingdom was made to hold all peoples.

I recognized the two referees walking toward me (I've known them for years) and smiled when they wanted to know what my connection was to the game that was to be played that night. They too smiled and nodded their affirmation as I said simply, "two sisters from Okabena are in the Confirmation class at the church I help out at."

Church connections have been crucially important in our church from the beginning, since the time of the Reformation. Founding documents of Lutheranism, in fact, define the church as the place where the Gospel is truly preached and the sacraments are rightly administered. (The ways that God most clearly and most powerfully has decided to be with us and to stay connected to us, to bring us to faith and to keep us in faith.)


