PASTOR JEANETTE'S ARTICLE

Dear First Lutheran and Grace Lutheran,

My family and I were able to attend Pastor's Family Camp at Green Lake Bible Camp the afternoon of June 18 to the evening of the 22. This is the third year we have attended this camp, and, therefore, we know the other families, staff and camp increasingly well. We have enjoyed building on these established relationships year after year. This opportunity is financially supported through the Southwestern MN Synod in an effort to support pastor families in completing their continuing education. Each year, pastors are to spend two weeks completing continuing education opportunities (approximately 50 hours). I often look for low cost opportunities for continuing education in our area (such as a class on Alzheimers, etc.). I have also participated in the Continuous Growth Pathways program (which offers classes at reduced rates). Thank you for supporting me as I complete my continuing education hours. Though it is a requirement for pastors, I know completing such education hours often requires others to "fill in" on various ministry tasks and entails financial costs, as well. I am grateful for those who have supported me as I have accessed such resources

This year, three different speakers shared about "story telling." Karen Kretschmann helped us to think about ways we can connect people's individual stories with the greater story of the church. We also considered the importance of how God is "with" us throughout the Biblical text and how we see ministries acting with each other, as well. Another speaker, Paul, helped us consider the importance of social media and how we should and should not utilize social media in our ministry. He helped us also consider which forms of social media would be more likely to connect with our target audiences. Lastly, Deacon Colleen Bernu, the Director of Evangelical Mission for the Northeastern MN ELCA Synod, shared her personal story of how she became a Lutheran and helped us consider how we could encourage people to share their stories. Since so much of Bible Study leading and preaching is, in fact, story telling, I found that the information was useful and insightful.

I encourage you to, as you read this newsletter article, consider your story of faith. What were the high points? What were the challenges? How does your story connect with our congregation's story? How does the story of your ancestors shape your story?

Of course, as always, the most valuable parts of continuing education were not the classes themselves. Rather, it was very useful to talk with other pastors and hear their insights from ministry and "pastor/parenting." The mutual encouragement was invaluable. Likewise, as a family, this opportunity is one of the few ways we get to worship together and our family appreciated the overall quality time we were able to spend together.

Thank you for your support in helping me complete my continuing education and take advantage of this good opportunity.




