PASTOR JEANETTE'S ARTICLE

Dear First Lutheran,

This past week I have tried to talk to Landon more about the upcoming Christmas play. I told him he would probably be an animal in the play, to which he responded that he would like to be the lion. I have tried to explain that the lion does not make an appearance in the Christmas play as the lion is not a safe animal to be around baby Jesus. Then, I tried to get Landon to practice the Christmas songs to which he responded, "No! It's not Christmas yet." This might be what I get for insisting we hang up some fall and Thanksgiving decorations before hanging up the Christmas ones.

I think Landon's words, "It's not Christmas yet," have value for all of us to hear, though. Soon we will start the Advent season as a church, though the rest of the world will launch right from Thanksgiving to Christmas. (In many places and stores, they've skipped over Thanksgiving entirely). There is great beauty in the Advent season, so I hope that we all take time to experience it. While the world rushes around trying to get ready for Christmas, we try to steal some moments to think and reflect about what this all means and what we are waiting and hoping for. For hundreds of years, the world waited for the Messiah, the Anointed one from David's family tree. They had hoped for someone who would help them to live in freedom and safety, not worrying about Roman imperialism or attacks from foreign powers. Instead they received this leader in the form of a humble baby, born to peasant parents. Still, this king, though not who they were expecting, would forever change the world.

Today, we are still waiting for Jesus in many ways. We are waiting for Jesus to enter into the broken places of our lives: relationships that need repair, addictions that overwhelm us, and decisions that haunt us. Advent gives us time and space to reflect on the ways we are waiting for Jesus to enter into our hearts and lives. The four weeks of Advent are traditionally themed: hope, peace, joy and love. During Advent, we both give thanks for the ways these four themes are present in our lives and also pray that they would become more present still in the world around us.

But, soon, before we know it and even maybe before we are ready for it, Christmas will be here. Once again, we will be reminded that Christ enters into our broken world to give us hope. As you find yourself preparing for family gatherings, celebrations with social groups and more, may you find ways to remember Christ's birth in the middle of it all. God became flesh to live amongst us, going through all the pain and agony we go through every single day. God became weak and humble to show us what true power and what God's kingdom is really about. It's so easy to say and also so easy to forget that Christmas isn't about how nice our homes look, the gifts or how good the meal tastes. It's not really even about how "well" our worship services happen. It's about Jesus entering into our midst and our hearts. May we not lose sight of that.

Jesus' Birth is Announced

"God's power will rest on you."

The word, which we translate into English as "rest on" or "overshadow" is rare in the Bible. One place you find it is in the book of Exodus. There it describes a strange cloud that overshadowed the tent when Israel placed it in the ark of the covenant, containing the tables of the commandments. As soon as the cloud over shadowed the tent, "the Lord's presence filled it." *Exodus* 40:34

Luke's choice of the rare word overshadow is not accidental; it is deeply symbolic.

Mary's body (new tent) houses her womb (new ark). When the Holy Spirit overshadows Mary, she is filled with the Lord's new presence, Jesus.

God now lives among his people., not just in the symbol of the tablets in the ark, but in the *person* of Jesus in Mary's womb.

How aware are we of Jesus' presence?

"From now on all people will call me happy, because of the great things the Mighty God has done for me." - Luke 1:48-49




