## PASTOR JEANETTE'S ARTICLE

Dear First Lutheran,

This week, I have been working on preparing an Ash Wednesday and Lent on lessons for Confirmation. I try to re-write my lessons and choose different topics each year so that we explore concepts and passages from different angles. This year, for Lent, I am emphasizing with our youth the importance of finding time for silence. Silence in prayer. Silence in worship. Silence in study. Lent is a season that is often less appealing than Christmas or Easter for the obvious reasons. But, the somber, quiet, reflective, calm, and serious nature of Lent is a gift to us. Our church calendar creates time and space for us to be intentionally quiet and look inward at our motives and longings. When we do this, we are sustained through the peace we find and gain clarity so that we can better serve the world. Silence may not always feel comfortable, fun or good. But, silence is a gift. Lent is a gift.

God speaks to us powerfully in silence. Our world is full of noise. People wanting things from us. News and information coming at us. Work demands being expressed to us. Music filling the air. These things are not inherently bad. In many ways, they are good. But, noise is bad if it is all we hear. We must make space for silence. When we create silence, we usually rid our lives and minds of distractions so we can consider what God desires for us and through us. We calm our mind and spirit so that we can better respond to the chaos around us.

This Lent, I encourage you to worship. I encourage you to explore one of First's Bible Studies. (We are planning on having a Lenten study during the Wednesday meal via the Nourishing Vocation Project's information and resources.) I encourage you to also find time to simply be in silence. I am someone who often has the tv on "for noise" in the background. On the way home or to work, I usually have a book, the radio or a podcast on. But, now, occasionally, I have decided to turn off all of these forms of noise and just listen to the silence. It has amazed me at how thirty minutes of silence in my commute makes me calmer for the workday or my family. It gives me a chance to think about the conversations that inspired me and the ones that troubled me. It gives me a chance to think about what I might really be called to do with my time, talent and treasure and what might, more so, be a distraction from my true calling. I do not naturally gravitate towards silence, but I have found silence to be a gift for me. I pray it may be a gift for you.


