# PASTOR JEANETTE'S ARTICLE

Dear First Lutheran,

I want to start off, first and foremost, by saying thank you for all of your generous donations this past year. With high inflation, I know many of you are probably feeling the "pinch" of trying to keep up with expenses while still giving to the church. I know how easy it would be to simply stop or drastically reduce giving, but I know many of you have continued to give despite the challenging situation. Your sacrifice has been noticed and appreciated. Likewise, this year, we have not only been working to meet our general budget but also addressing many issues with our building such as tuck pointing, repairing the roof and fixing the wall of the sanctuary. These projects were necessary, but, of course, costly. Many groups and individuals covered over \$39,000 worth of repair expenses and our insurance covered much of the roof and wall repair. Only around \$17,000 is left to pay on these projects.


As the year went on, we noticed the deficit in our general budget increasing. Recently, though, three individuals gave over \$30,000 towards the general budget. Currently, we are around \$22,163 behind budget. (We borrow internally from non-designated funds to cover such deficits until we can "catch up.") We know that many of you are planning to give generously after harvest has finished. Thank you in advance for your investment in our shared mission together.

Stewardship has several special events coming up to help us raise funds for First Lutheran. Starting on November 2, there will be a "Pie Event." Various youth and adults will have buckets with their photos on it. A youth will be placed "against" an adult. People can give money for the person they would like to see pied. On December 10, we will pie the "winners." On All Saints Sunday (November 5), volunteers are also hosting a brunch after worship. Thank you to Stewardship for creatively coming up with ways to help us raise money for the church. The "fun" nature behind these events reminds us that giving is not only a duty but also our joy! We give with joy, knowing that God has blessed us abundantly and will continue to do so while we give. We give with joy because it is a honor to be a part of doing God's work in the world.

Please keep First Lutheran in your hearts and minds as you plan your giving for the end of 2023. God is doing great things here! Our Kids for Christ program has over 30 youth involved. We have Confirmation kids who are remaining involved despite being Confirmed. We are strengthening our partnership with not only Grace Lutheran but also First United Methodist and others. Grief Share has invited new participants. We visit many shut-ins/nursing home residents/hospital patients on a regular basis and complete services in a variety of locations with elderly people in attendance. Our choir has invited new people this year. Our funeral ministry supports families in times of great loss. We are planning great summer trips for our kids. We are engaging in life-changing outreach through our winter clothing ministry, God's Work our Hands, Meals on Wheels, Every Meal distributions and more. It's not just something we say during offering, our money, gifts, time and talents really are making good things happen here. I urge you to continue to invest in our many worthy ministry efforts.


